Apuntes: Definite & Indefinite Articles

Definite Articles:

- They used when you are referring to a specific item or a specific group of items.
- They are placed BEFORE the nouns.
- They are masculine or feminine and/or singular or plural.
- They are all translated to mean "THE".
- They must Match the noun they are placed before in Number, which means that if the noun they are placed before is singular the Definite Article MUST be singular and if the noun they are placed before is plural the Definite Article MUST be plural.
- They must Match the noun they are placed before in Gender, which means that if the noun they are placed before is masculine the Definite Article Must be masculine and if the noun they are placed before is feminine the Definite Article must be feminine.

SINGULAR	PLURAL
EL (masculine)	LOS (masculine)
LA (feminine)	LAS (feminine)

DEFINITE ARTICLES

Indefinite Articles:

- They used when you are referring to an unspecified item or an unspecified group of items.
- They are placed BEFORE the nouns.
- They are masculine or feminine and/or singular or plural.
- The singular indefinite articles (both masculine and feminine) are translated to mean "A" or "AN".
- The plural indefinite articles (both masculine and feminine) are translated to mean "SOME" or "A FEW".
- They must Match the noun they are placed before in Number, which means that if the noun they are placed before is singular the Definite Article MUST be singular and if the noun they are placed before is plural the Definite Article MUST be plural.
- They must Match the noun they are placed before in Gender, which means that if the noun they are placed before is masculine the Definite Article Must be masculine and if the noun they are placed before is feminine the Definite Article must be feminine.

UN (masculine)	UNOS (masculine)
UNA (feminine)	UNAS (feminine)

INDEFINITE ARTICLES
